I. AMARD OF SOLDIER'S NEDAL: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Soldier's Medal is awarded to:

Corporal RCBERT C. SALLEY, 34166444, CAC (AA), 217th Antiaircraft Artillery Gun Battalion (Mobile), for heroism not involving actual conflict with the enemy in Germany on 16 April 1945. While undergoing repairs, a span of a partially destroyed bridge collapsed and pinioned several men beneath falling debris. Rushing to the aid of the trapped men, Corporal SALLEY crawled beneath the heavy rubble and helped to extricate the casualties. Although the intact portion of the structure threatened to collapse, he remained at the position until the injured received emergency first aid and were evacuated. Corporal SALLEY's exceptional courage and steadfast concern for the safety of others uphold the high traditions of the Armed Services of the United States. Entered Military Service from Alabama.

Technician Fifth Grade JCHN R. GURNEE, 32727976, CAC (AA), 217th Antiair-craft Artillery Gun Battalion (Mobile), for heroism not involving actual conflict with the enemy in Germany on 16 April 1945. When a span of a partially demolished bridge collapsed during repairs and buried several soldiers beneath pinioning rubble, Technician GURNEE ran quickly to the aid of the stricken men. Lifting the heavy concrete from the trapped and injured, he succeeded in removing the casualties and remained until they had received first aid treatment and had been evacuated to safety. Although the intact portion of the structure threatened by his actions, he helped to save many lives. Entered Military Service from New York.

Private First Class ROBERT I. DAVIES, 32587633, MD, 217th Antiaircraft Artillery Gun Battalion (Nobile), for heroism not involving actual conflict with the enemy in Germany on 16 April 1945. When a span of a bridge collapsed while undergoing repairs and buried several men beneath heavy rubble, Private First Class DAVIED dashed to the aid of the traped soldiers and worked tirelessly to extricate them. Although the intact portion of the structure threatened to fall, he remained fearlessly at his tasks until the casualties were removed, administered first aid and evacuated. His brave and aggressive efforts were instrumental in saving many lives and uphold the high standards of the Medical Corps. Entered Military Service from New York.

Private First Class ROBERT SASSER, 36894681, C.C (AA), 217th Antiaircraft Artillery Gun Battalion (Pobile), for heroism not involving actual conflict with

the enemy in Germany on 16 April 1945. A partially destroyed bridge near JENA was undergoing repairs when a span collapsed and pinned several men beneath falling debris. Rushing to the aid of the trapped soldiers, Private First Class SASSAR dove into the icy water of the stream below and held an improvised gangway over his head while stretcher bearers walked over it to evacuate the injured. By his courageous and determined actions, Private First Class SASSER helped to save many lives and brought high credit upon himself and the Army. Entered Military Service from Michigan.

II. AMARD, FOSTHUNCUS, OF BRONZE STAR NEDAL: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded post-humously to:

Captain DAVIS B. MAUIDIN, 0471379, CE, 281st Engineer Combat Battalion, for meritorious achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 1 April 1945. Entered Military Service from Texas. Next of kin: Mrs. Foncille Mauldin (wife), 708 West Third Street, Breckenridge, Texas.

III. AWARD OF BRONZE ST R MEDAL, MISSING IN ACTION: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Technician Third Grade ELMER R. MCTTELL 35026179, MD, 58th Armored Field Artiflery Battalion, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy in French Morocco, Tunisia, Sicily, England, France, Belgium and Germany between 2 November 1942 and 19 December 1944. Entered Military Service from Chio. Next of kin: Mrs. Nellie Hottell (mother), Lakewood, Chio.

IV. AMARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Staff Sergeant (then Technician Fourth Grade) FLOYD W. HARRISCN, 36588952, CAV, 43rd Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized), for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 3 March 1945. During an attack on PELSBACH, an assault force was subjected to intense enemy shell-fire and several casualties resulted. Seeing a soldier fall wounded, Sergeant MARMISON ran to his side and administered emergency first aid, remaining with the stricken man until he could be evacuated. His courageous actions were instrumental in saving a life and are in keeping with the high standards of the Military Forces. Entered Military Service from Michigan.

Sergeant HUBERT O. STUINT, 18050748, C.V., 19th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized), for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 27 March 1945. Sergeant STUART accompanied a small patrol across the RHINE HIVER to reconnoiter enemy territory. Under the cover of darkness, he and his comrades crept quietly past German guards and established an observation post from which hostile movements could be observed.

Throughout the following day, the men remained at the position although they were often exposed to artillery fire. After procuring vital information, Sergeant STUART and the patrol returned safely to the friendly shore. His courageous actions contributed greatly to subsequent crossings of the river and brought great credit upon himself and the Armed Services of the United States. Entered Military Service from Arkansas.

Corporal ALBERT D. STURTZ, 33017077, CAV, 19th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized), for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 27 March 1945. Corporal STURTZ was a member of a patrol which crossed the RHITE HIVER to reconnoiter enemy movements and dispositions. Advancing past hostile outposts, Corporal STURTZ and his comrades established an observation post and occupied the position throughout the following day. Narrowly escaping detection, the party was able to recross the river and return to friendly lines with vital information which was invaluable to subsequent assault operations. Corporal STURTZ's exceptional daring and aggressive determination uphold the high traditions of the Army. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

Corporal (then Technician Fifth Grade) ANDREW P. TALARICK, 12134099, CAV, 16th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Pechanized), for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 27 March 1945. Corporal TALARICK was a member of a small patrol which crossed the RHINE RIVER in an assault boat on a reconnaissance mission. With great skill and daring, he and his conrades crept past enemy sentries and emplacements and obtained information which proved invaluable to a subsequent river crossing operation. Corporal TALARICK's high courage and devotion to his duty are in keeping with the high traditions of the Army of the United States. Entered Military Service from New Jersey.

BESLETICLED

Corporal BENJAMIN F. TRAYLOR, 34579981, FA, 177th Field Artillery Battalion, for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 26 April 1945. While constructing a bridge on the DANUSE RIVER, a platoon of engineers was pinned down by heavy enemy small-arms and machine gun fire. After failing in an attempt to obtain artillery support, Corporal TRAYLOR left cover, drove his vehicle fearlessly across open, shell-swept ground and procured two heavy machine guns. Returning to his position, he manned one of the weapons and engaged the foe. His fearless actions helped to rout the attackers from their commanding positions, enabling the bridging operation to continue. Entered Military Service from Georgia.

Technician Fifth Grade JASPER T. RAUCH, 64213628, FA, 58th Armored Field artiflery partains, against the enemy in France on 26 July 1944. Technician RAUCH's unit was occupying a bivouac position near MARIGNY when the area was bombed by enemy aircraft. Seeing a half-track burst into flame as a result of a direct hit, Technician MAUCH summoned medical aid men and dashed through the hail of falling explosives to the scene. Fearlessly he fought the growing blaze and directed the aid men to the injured occupants of the vehicle. By his courageous and aggressive actions, Technician RAUCH saved valuable military equipment from destruction and prevented serious loss of life. Entered Military Service from South Carolina.

Technician Fifth Grade L. C. SCUTH, 34335087, MD, 19th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized), for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 31 March 1945. During an attack on METHERIC, Technician SCUTH rede in an ambulance through heavy enemy fire to the aid of a wounded man. Disregarding the danger, he exposed himself to lift the casualty from a disabled armored car and to administer first aid. As he did so, Technician SCUTH was seriously wounded. His high courage and devotion to the welfare of others above his own helped to save a life and brought great credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered Military Service from Alabama.

Private First Class M.RTIN R. CHERNIN, 35399657, FA, 284th Field Artillery Battalion, for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany between 23 February 1945 and 28 February 1945. Private First Class CHERNIN served as a member of a forward observation team which supported the 5th Ranger Infantry Battalion in an attack on a strategic objective. After occupying the position, the troops found themselves surrounded by a numerically superior enemy. Under incessant hostile fire, Private First Class CHERNIN went to the front-lines and fought as a rifleman, helping to repulse repeated German counter-attacks. His high courage and aggressive determination inspired his comrades to redoubled effort and helped to secure the position. Entered Military Service from Ohio.





I. AWARD OF SILVER STAR: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Silver Star is awarded to:

First Lieutenant (then Second Lieutenant), CHARLES E. SMITH, 01170196, FA 274th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, for gallantry in action in Germany on 21 March 1945. During an armored advance near WAIDFISHBACK, Lieutenant SMITH's tank was subjected to heavy machine-gun fire and at the same time, a liaison plane reported that energy machines were approaching his position. Disregarding the heavy fire, he stood on his tank turret and signaled his exact position to the air observer, receiving in turn the location of the enemy. Lieutenant SMITH's gallant actions led to the destruction of the hostile tanks and the completion of the mission. Entered Military Service from Kentucky.

Second Lieutenant J.MES C. HIPP, 01996448, FA, 58th Armored Field artillery Battalion, for gallantry in action in Germany between 17 November 1944 and 18 November 1944. Advancing with the infantry in an attack on SHERPENSEEL, Lieutenant HIPP adjusted effective artillery fire upon the German defenders. After establishing an observation post, he observed enemy snipers inflicting severe casualties among the troops. Braving a hail of fire, he manned a machine gun and riddled the hostile positions. Although painfully wounded, Lieutenant HIPP refused to be evacuated until the mission was successfully completed. Entered Military Service from South Carolina.

Technician Fifth Grade M.RTIN L. ANDERSON, JR., 32233022, CE, 135th Engineer Combat Battalion, for gallantry in action in Germany on 27 March 1945. Technician ANDERSON greatly facilitated the movement of troops across the RHINE HIVER. Although his boat was riddled by enemy fire and several infantrymen were wounded, he was able to reach an island in midstream. There he engaged a hostile force, killed two of their number and wounded many others. Technician ANDERSON remained to mirister to his conrades until help arrived. His gallantry and devotion to duty merit the highest praise. Entered Military Service from New York.

Private First Class FRANK E. ROBOTH M, 37490564, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for gallantry in action in Germany on 24 February 1945. During an assault crossing of the SAAR RIVER, Private First Class ROBOTHAM repeatedly exposed himself to hostile fire to administer first aid to the wounded and to evacuate then to safety. Although the engineer crews were compelled to withdraw from the position, he remained until all casualties were removed. Private First Class ROBOTH M's bravery and steadfast devotion to the welfare of others are in keeping with the highest standards of the Army. Entered Military Service from Nebraska.



II. AWARD OF OAK-LEAF CLUSTER TO SILVER STAR: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, in addition to the Silver Star previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

Staff Sergeant KARL V. MASTERSON, 42006739, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for gallantry in action in Germany on 22 February 1945. Sergeant MASTERSON'S company was assigned the mission of supporting an assault crossing of the SAAR RIVER. Despite incessant enemy fire which riddled engineer boats and inflicted severe casualties, he rallied his men and directed the operation until all the infantry had been transported across the river. Sergeant MASTERSON'S inspiring leadership and aggressiveness merit the highest proise. Entered Military Service from New Jersey.

III. AWARD, POSTHUMOUS, OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded posthumously to:

Corporal WILLIAM H. WESTMOREL.ND, 20456599, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 23 February 1945. Assigned the mission of constructing an infantry support raft, Corporal WESTMORELAD remained at work despite heavy enemy fire until the structure was completed. Shortly after the raft was placed in operation, he was killed by mortar fire. Corporal WESTMORELAD's bravery and devotion to duty merit the highest praise. Entered Military Service from Tennessee. Next of Kin: Mrs. Ethel Westmoreland (wife), 66 Franklin Street, Lowell, Massachusetts.

IV. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL: Under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

First Lieutenant TYSSUL G. THOMAS, Oll75882, FA, 58th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Bolgium on 20 December 1944. During a concerted enemy counter-attack on his position, Lieutenant THOMAS exposed himself to hostile fire to adjust artillery fire upon German tanks and infantry. His courageous and aggressive actions enabled his unit to withdraw to safety with a minimum of casualties and brought great credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

Second Lieutenant T. G. McDONAID, Oll14645, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in France on 15 August 1944. Lieutenant McDONAID led a patrol into CHARTRES to procure needed intelligence information. After locating camouflaged installations, the party was subjected to intense enemy fire and forced to withdraw. By his aggressive leadership and cool courage, Lieutenant McDONAID was able to return with his men to safety. His actions contributed to the success of subsequent operations and deserve great praise. Entered Military Service from Virginia.

Staff Sergeant ALVIN C. STOWE, 32582192, CAC (AA), 574th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion (Self-Propelled), for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the energy in Germany on 1 May 1945. When a strong energy force attacked his position, Sergeant STOWE manned a machine gun mounted on a half-track and poured deadly fire upon the foe. By his courageous and aggressive action, the German thrust was quickly disorganized and repelled. Sergeant STOWE's conduct under fire inspired those who served with



him and brought distinct credit upon himself and the Army. Entered Military Service from New York.

Sergeant GUS E. COLLINS, 35771925, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 7 December 1944. During a ferrying operation on the SAAR RIVER, Sergeant COLLINS and his men were fired upon by an enemy machine gun. Upon investigating, he learned that the weapon was emplaced in a pillbox. Disregarding the danger, Sergeant COLLINS procured two dynamite charges and quickly neutralized the emplacement, enabling the operation to continue. His brave actions merit high praise. Entered Military Service from West Virginia.

Sergeant WALLACE W. DOUGLASS, 42005565, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 6 December 1944. During an assault crossing of the SAAR RIVER, Sergeant DOUGLASS and a boat crew made twenty-one trips across the river to ferry infantrymen to the opposite shore. On one occasion, he maneuvered his craft into direct enemy fire to save a drowning soldier. Sergeant DOUGLASS courage, technical skill and loyalty to duty merit high praise. Entered Military Service from New Jersey.

Sergeant DCMINICK FALONE, 42006943, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 23 February 1945. Under incessant enemy artillery, mortar and small-arms fire, Sergeant FALONE guided bridge floats from a delivery site to an assembly area. Working tirelessly for twelve continuous hours, he successfully completed his assignment despite the fact that twenty-seven floats were rendered useless by enemy fire. Sergeant FALONE's courage and steadfast devotion to duty are worthy of high praise. Entered Military Service from New Jersey.

Sergeant Harlan O. STAUFFER, 35881956, CE, 135th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 23 February 1945. During a bridging operation, Sergeant STAUFFER, disregarding heavy enemy fire, waded into the SAAR RIVER to hold in place an assembled bridge section which had been torn from its moorings by an exploding shell. Although suffering from exhaustion and exposure, Sergeant STAUFFER refused to be evacuated until the mission was completed. His courageous acts merit high praise. Entered Military Service from Ohio.

Corporal STANLEY V. KLONOWSKI, JR., 35058486, FA, 274th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 2 December 1944. When an armored column halted by a roadblock was subjected to heavy enemy fire, Corporal KLONOWSKI, disregarding the danger, dragged a radio cable over one hundred and fifty yards of shell-swept ground to establish communications with an observation post. By his courageous and aggressive actions, Corporal KLONOWSKI made possible the prompt adjustment of fire upon hostile positions. Entered Military Service from Ohio.

Corporal SAM MEYERS, 32115913, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany between 13 December 1944 and 21 February 1945. During three crossing operations, Corporal MEYERS distinguished minself by his outstanding courage. On 13 December 1944 he exposed himself to enemy fire to secure a ferry carrying two trucks and to drive the vehicles to safety. On 6 February 1945, he



performed hazardous duties while engaged in a bridging operation and on 21 February 1945, he cleared wreckage from a bridge site under incessant artillery bombardment. Entered Military Service from New York.

Corporal JOHN R. PRIZINSKY, 33681813, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 21 February 1945. During an assault crossing of the SAAR RIVER at AYL, Corporal PRIZINSKY braved intense enemy fire to evacuate two wounded men to safety. His courageous disregard for his own safety and his loyal devotion to the welfare of others contributed to the saving of life and brought high credit upon himself and the Army of the United States. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

Corporal (then Private First Class) EDWARD C. SIDELINGER, 33682582, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 23 February 1945. During ferrying operations on the SAAR KIVER, Corporal SIDELINGER operated a motor-propelled raft. Despite incessant enemy fire, he remained at his hazardous tasks until the mission was completed. His courageous and determined efforts made possible the movement of critical supplies across the river and brought high credit upon himself and the Army of the United States. Entered Military Service from Pennsylvania.

Technician Fifth Grade WILLIAM J. BOWSER, 37663565, CE, 996th Engineer Treadway Bridge Company, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 10 December 1944. When intense hostile shell-fire made a bridge site untenable, Technician BOWSER voluntarily drove a wrecker to the position to recover abandoned equipment. By his courageous and determined actions, he saved valuable material and contributed greatly to the successful operation of his unit. Technician BOWSER brought high credit upon himself and the Armed Forces. Entered Military Service from Iowa.

Technician Fifth Grade (then Private) ANTHONY J. DeNARDO, 32088410, CWS, 81st Chemical Mortar Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in France on 12 August 1944. When a soldier was seriously wounded during an enemy bombardment of his plateen's position, Technician Denardo braved the intense fire to procure a vehicle and to drive the casualty to a medical installation. His prompt and courageous actions were instrumental in saving a life and are in keeping with the high traditions of the Army. Entered Military Service from New York.

Technician Fifth Grade RAYMOND G. KNAJDEK, 36511705, MD, 5th Ranger Infantry Battalien, for heroic service in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany between 2 December 1944 and 5 December 1944. During an attack, Technician KNAJDEK fearlessly exposed himself to intense hestile fire to administer first aid to casualties. When his company had attained the objective, he repeatedly crossed open, shell-swept ground to treat and evacuate the wounded. Technician KNAJDEK's courage and devetien to the welfare of others are in keeping with the high standards of the Medical Corps. Entered Military Service from Wisconsin.

Technician Fifth Grade ROBERT H. M.BE, 33650212, MD, 160th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 7 December 1944. During a bridging operation on the SAAR RIVER, Technician MABE wed an intense hostile artille bembardment to



administer first aid to a seriously wounded man. By his prompt and skillful actions, he was able to arrest a severe hemorrhage caused by the man's injury and to evacuate him to the battalion aid station for plasma treatment. Technician MABE's services merit high praise. Entered Military Service from Virginia.

Technician Fifth Grade IRVIN W. SARGENT, 11055724, MD, 135th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 28 March 1945. Technician SARGENT, an aid man, braved heavy enemy fire to administer medical treatment to engineers wounded during an assault crossing of the RHINE KIVER. He remained at his hazardous tasks throughout the night and was instrumental in the removal of many casualties to safety. Technician SARGENT's courage and diligent application to duty are in keeping with the high traditions of the Medical Corps. Entered Military Service from Vermont.

Private First Class MaRVIN H. BREWER, 35224158, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 24 February 1945. During the construction of a ferry on the SAAR RIVER, Private First Class BREWER braved heavy enemy fire to treat and evacuate wounded from the site. He persevered at his hazardous tasks until all casualties were removed to safety. Private First Class BREWER's courage and devotion to the welfare of others are worthy of high praise. Entered Military Service from Ohio.

Private First Class EUGENE F. JUSTICE, 32955222, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 1 April 1945. When his company was fired upon by an enemy force near MELSUNGEN, Private First Class JUSTICE manned a machine gun mounted on a truck and returned the fire. Although he was seriously wounded, he remained at his weapon until his corrades were able to withdraw. Private First Class JUSTICE's high courage and unswerving loyalty to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the Army of the United States. Entered Military Service from New Jersey.

Private First Class CLIFFORD H. LaFOREST, 36451768, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in France on 6 November 1944. During an assault crossing of the MOSELLE RIVER, Private First Class LaFOREST took charge of a boat loaded with infantrymen and successfully reached the hostile shore. He then returned across the river with a casualty, braving intense hostile fire to evacuate him to safety. Private First Class LaFOREST's courage and devetion to the welfare of others are in keeping with the high traditions of the Army. Entered Military Service from Michigan.

Private First Class JOHN MUNTIN, 36898037, CE, 179th Engineer Combat Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 10 December 1944. During the construction of treadway ponton rafts on the SAAR MIVER, Private First Class MUNTIN's platoon was pinned down by intense enemy fire. Disregarding the danger, he repeatedly crossed shell-swept terrain to drive valuable vehicles to cover. Private First Class MUNTIN's high courage and aggressiveness contributed greatly to the operations of his unit and brought distinct credit upon himself and the Army. Entered Military Service from Michigan.



Private First Class (then Private) HAROLD F. WE THERMAN, 35218682, FA, 274th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy in Germany on 9 March 1945. When his battalion convoy was subjected to heavy enemy artillery fire in the town of ISSEL, Private First Class WEATHEIMAN braved danger to assist his battery commander in dispersing the vehicles. His prompt and courageous actions helped to save much valuable equipment from destruction and brought great credit upon himself and the army. Entered Military Service from Ohio.
